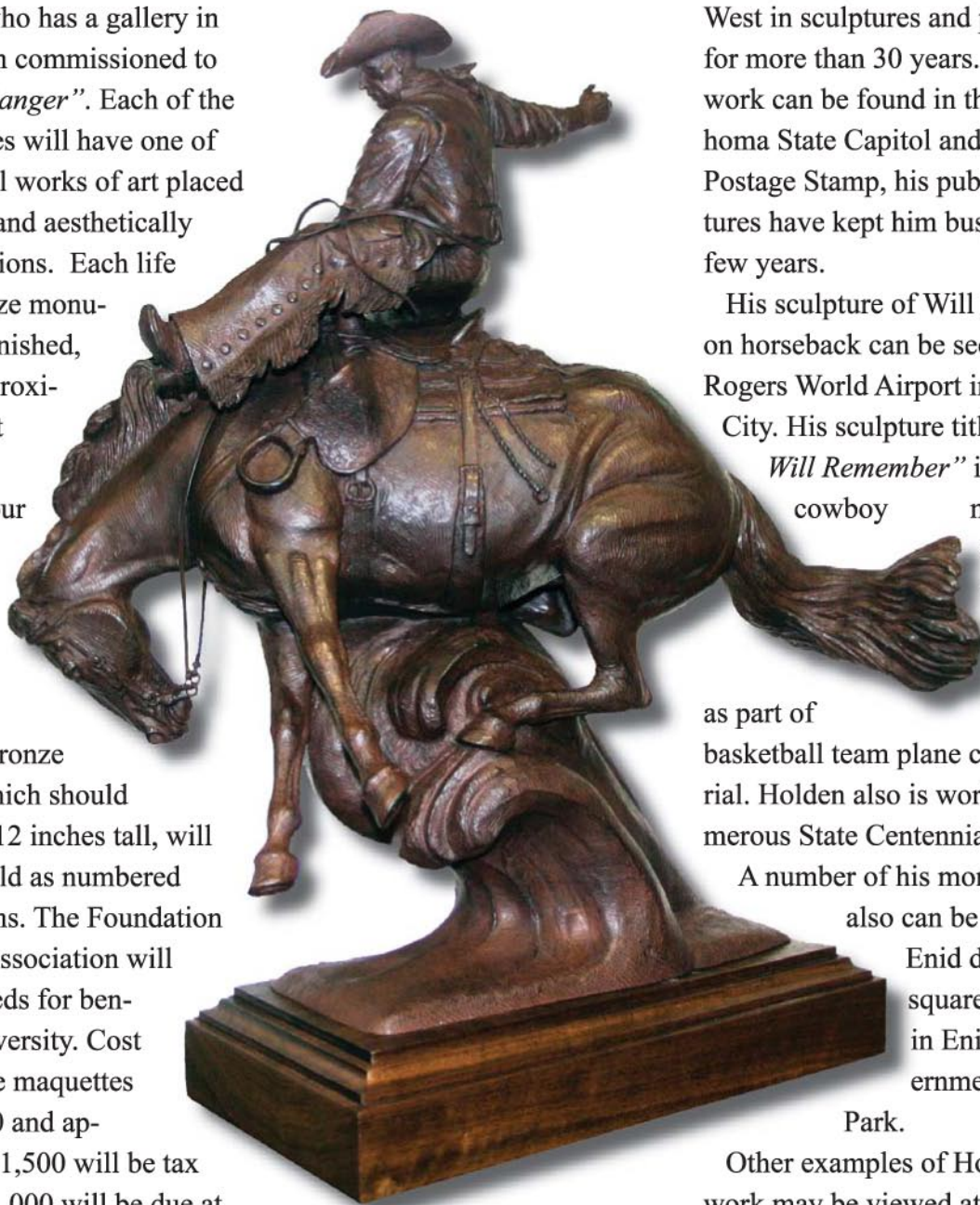

THE RANGER

Western artist Harold Holden of Kremlin, who has a gallery in Enid, has been commissioned to create "The Ranger". Each of the three campuses will have one of these beautiful works of art placed in prominent and aesthetically pleasing locations. Each life and quarter size monument, when finished, will stand approximately 10 feet high and be placed on a four foot base. In honor of Northwestern's 110 years of service, 110 bronze maquettes, which should measure 9 to 12 inches tall, will be cast and sold as numbered limited editions. The Foundation and Alumni Association will use the proceeds for benefit of the university. Cost for each of the maquettes will be \$2,500 and approximately \$1,500 will be tax deductible. \$1,000 will be due at the order date with the remainder due at delivery.



THE ARTIST

Holden has been capturing the West in sculptures and paintings for more than 30 years. While his work can be found in the Oklahoma State Capitol and on a U.S. Postage Stamp, his public sculptures have kept him busy the last few years.

His sculpture of Will Rogers on horseback can be seen at Will Rogers World Airport in Oklahoma City. His sculpture titled "We
