■ Woodward Baccalaureate Degrees

Students attending classes at Northwestern-Woodward are able to take the same types of undergraduate courses that are available at Northwestern's main campus in Alva. Professors are available on-site, as well as via Interactive Television (ITV). Courses may include anything from business administration, accounting, criminal justice and computer science to education, nursing, psychology and social work.
